IPCH Jury Certification

IPCH Jury Members will get the official international IPCH Jury License (starting or higher license), after functioning in an official IPCH Competition with positive judge result of the IPCH Chief Jury, the Assistant Chief Jury and the IPCH Technical Delegate.

“Chief Jury” is the highest IPCH Jury Certification. Then follows “Assistant Chief Jury”, “Senior Jury” and the lowest, starting certification is “Second Jury”.

“Trainee Jury Members” are following an IPCH Jury Course to learn all about being a Jury Member.

Second Jury

- To become a Second Jury:
 - The Jury Member shall have good knowledge of the IPCH Game Rules, IPCH Competition Regulations and IPCH Jury Handbook.
 - The Jury Member shall have a reasonable knowledge of the English language*.
 - The Jury Member shall have achieved the age of 18 before the first day of the competition.
 - The Jury Member shall have functioned as Trainee Jury in an IPCH Competition, in a way that is judged positive by the Chief Jury and the Assistant Chief Jury.
 - The Chief Jury and Assistant Chief Jury give advice to the Technical Delegate to finally decide about the certification.

- A Second Jury is allowed to:
 - Observe and judge Referees in official IPCH Competitions, together with a Senior Jury.

Senior Jury

- To become a Senior Jury:
 - The Jury Member shall have functioned as Second Jury in minimal 6 matches (has observed at least 6 referees) in IPCH Competitions, in a way that is judged positive by the Chief Jury and the Assistant Chief Jury.
 - The Chief Jury and Assistant Chief Jury give advice to the Technical Delegate to finally decide about the certification.

A Senior Jury is allowed to:

- Observe and judge Referees in IPCH Competitions and Course Events.
- Coach Second Jury.

Assistant Chief Jury

- To become an Assistant Chief Jury:
 - The Jury Member shall be a Senior Jury.
 - An Assistant Chief Jury will be appointed by the IPCH Executive Committee.

- An Assistant Chief Jury is allowed, under supervision of the Chief Jury, to:
 - Lead / Coach the Jury Team during IPCH Competitions.
 - Observe and judge Second Jury, Senior Jury in IPCH Competitions and Jury Course Events.
 - Observe and judge Referees in IPCH Competitions and Referee Course Events.

Chief Jury

- To become a Chief Jury:
 - The Jury Member shall have functioned as Senior Jury or Assistant Chief Jury in minimal 6 matches (observed at least 6 referees) in IPCH Competitions, in a way that is judged positive by the Chief Jury and the Technical Delegate.
 - A Chief Jury will be appointed by the IPCH Executive Committee.

 - A Chief Jury is allowed to:
 - Lead / Coach the Jury Team during IPCH Competitions.
 - Observe and judge Second Jury, Senior Jury and Assistant Chief Jury in IPCH Competitions and Jury Course Events.
 - Observe and judge Referees in IPCH Competitions and Referee Course Events.

*** Clarification**

To become an official international IPCH Jury Member, the Jury Member shall have a reasonable knowledge of the English language. Reasons:

- English is the official IPCH language.
- Jury Members need to communicate with colleague Jury Members, Referees, Players, Match Assistants, Technical Delegate, Organisers etc..

With 'reasonable knowledge of the English language' is meant: the person is able to understand, speak, read, write and communicate in English, so that other persons can understand the person.

The English proficiency doesn't have to be perfect / excellent.

Regulation

In case it isn't possible to appoint Jury Members for IPCH Competitions as described above the IPCH Executive Committee has the right to appoint Jury Members for the several jury functions.
